Christ is Risen - Alleluia!

He is Risen indeed – Alleluia!

Today, more than Christmas Day, is the most important Feast of the Church's year.

Some years ago, our Choirs sang for the Mothers' Union Carol Service in St. Martin's in the Bull Ring. The preacher used a "pass the parcel" visual aid in which different layers of a Christmas present were stripped off eventually to reveal the true meaning of Christmas. One by one the layers were shed to reveal Shepherds, Wise Men, animals, a star and more, until at last we got to the Baby. Surely that was the true meaning of Christmas: the Incarnation? Yet there was a remaining layer — what could that be? Slowly the final paper came off to reveal....... The Cross. That was the true meaning of Christmas — the purpose of the Incarnation itself: God's redemptive mission for all humankind on the Cross and its aftermath in the Resurrection.

In the words of the Easter carol, "This Joyful Eastertide":

Had Christ, that once was slain

Ne'er burst his three-day prison,

Our faith had been in vain:

But now hath Christ arisen, ARISEN, ARISEN!

So Christmas – and each one of us - is safe in the arms of the Cross – and in the joy of the Resurrection!
