There's a story I love which is connected with today's feast of Epiphany.

Babushka is a lonely old Russian Grandma who lives in a remote cottage, and she is very house-proud.

One snowy night, three strangers come looking for hospitality, and Babushka reluctantly invites them in, offering a meal and a bed for the night. The men are strangely dressed in rich but tattered clothes, as if they have travelled a long distance. Over the meal they explain about their quest to find a holy child, and the star which guides them. Babushka is keen to join them, and they agree to travel together.

The next morning, the travellers are eager to set off at first light, but Babushka hesitates. She cannot leave an untidy house. So they set off and she sets to sweeping and mopping, promising to catch up with them later. When at last she is ready, bringing some sweets and a doll for the Christ child, she hurries to join the wise men. But she can find no sign of them. Arriving at the next village she asks around, but to no avail. There is a baby, however, so she leaves her gifts with him, for who knows - perhaps this is the child she is seeking! And on she travels to the next village, but still there is no sign of the mysterious travellers. Still, she is determined to keep searching.

In fact, Babushka is still travelling the world to this day, searching for the Christ child especially at Christmas time. And wherever she goes, she brings gifts for children and leaves her blessing, treating each one as special and precious, because she knows that any one of them may be the Christ child she is seeking.
