Thought for the Day by Mark Simons

I ask a question; how do you find praying? There would be a huge range of responses if we were to ask this in a survey!

What does prayer mean for you? For me, it's a relationship with God, to bring the needs of the world, the church, the community, for others and then for ourselves.

For some there is a regular rhythm and pattern that flows easily, but even as a minister of the church, I struggle at times to pray, sometimes not having the words, or having the time, or distracted by the tasks needing to be done.

In every generation, there seems to be a way of praying, in posture, in form of words, in action. Each generation has expressed the prayers of the heart and soul in creative and imaginative ways.

Ways of praying could include prayer beads, rosaries, holding crosses, praying with colour, praying through photography, praying with icons, prayer with music, prayer walks, prayer books, prayer dancing, labyrinths, praying in silence and countless other ways.

It is an important part of our Christian faith, either praying individually or together as a community. Prayer is a spiritual time to be with God, bringing to God what is on your heart and mind, whether a world event or something closer to home concerning a loved one.

To pray is to experience the love of God, Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit. It can change the way we think about our lives and opens us to be transformed by God.

Prayer can happen in many ways, and it is ok to find a way that helps you - there is no wrong way to pray! Sometimes the simplest thing can be powerful.

Remember that God hears every prayer - but not all prayers are answered in the way we might expect or desire: we don't always pray for his will to be done!

Our main morning services are called to prayer by our bells, our prayer will be in word and sacrament, then in our action through charity giving such as Christian Aid that we remember and reflect.

Prayer is a discipline - it can be difficult at times, just like keeping fit, being on a diet, or keeping weeds down in the garden. Little and often is best, but don't give up! No prayer, however inadequate you may feel it to be, is ever wasted or of no value.

There is also the opportunity to be anointed with oil. Both are optional; you are simply invited to come as you are, bringing and sharing your burdens with God who knows us deeply.

Restore training course

Restore have an in-person training course which will take place on 11th, 18th and 25th June 2024 at The Rep Theatre, Birmingham for anyone interested in befriending a refugee or finding out more about refugee issues.

Restore, a project of Birmingham Churches Together, works with refugees and asylum seekers in Birmingham, Solihull, and Smethwick. Their befriending scheme involves the training and matching of trained volunteers with recently arrived refugees and asylum seekers to provide flexible, one-to-one relational support.

You are welcome to attend if you are interested in becoming a befriender or if you interested in learning more about people seeking asylum and refugees. Those interested in befriending opt into the application process at the end of the course.
