# Thought for the Day by Una Lodge

In approaching this year's Mothering Sunday I began to think about the idea of God as Mother rather than Father. Julian of Norwich says that 'just as God is our Father, so God is also our Mother', emphasising that one does not exclude the other. Of course, we all 'know' that God is not gendered, but what does this mean to us in our mental representations of God? The language that we use in any context is full of power in forming and framing the ideas that we have about the world, and much of the language that we have historically used in church to describe God is male gendered. As I sat in church last Sunday, I started leafing through the service booklet and began to wonder how it would feel if every time we used the word Father in the service we substituted it with Mother?

I recently listened to a podcast in which the American theologian Thomas Oord was exploring the concept of God as omnipotent. He mentioned a word in the Bible that is commonly translated as 'Almighty' and suggested that a possible translation is 'the breasted one', a feminine image which emphasises the nature of God as one who feeds and nurtures, and perhaps a different notion of 'mightiness' compared to what we are used to. It is interesting to reflect on the implications of our mental representations of God on our relationship with her/him/them/it. What qualities do we associate with mothering? These will vary depending on our own experience of being mothered, but

to think of God as ideal mother can perhaps remind us of a God who is the source of life, a comforter and nurturer, always there for us, who loves us unreservedly despite our failings.

## **New Electoral roll**

Every six years, a completely new church Electoral Roll must be prepared in each parish. 2025 is the year to prepare the new roll.

Electoral rolls provide a true indication of the real membership and strength of the Church, both locally and nationally. Putting your name on the roll is a way of saying "I belong"; it is an act of commitment to your local church and to the Church as a whole.

Joining the electoral roll opens up the way for greater involvement in the life of the Church, at parish, deanery, diocesan and national levels. You become entitled to vote at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting.

It is an important statement of witness, and step along the path of discipleship. With your name on the electoral roll the strength of the Church can be seen in our area, and across the country.

Please do complete the application form by using <u>this link</u>. The form only takes a minute to complete, and your response will be automatically uploaded into Churchdesk, our secure church management system. Please note that if you complete this electronic form, you **do not** need to complete the paper forms which are in church. **The form is now open and will close on Monday 14**<sup>th</sup> **April**.

If you are unsure whether you are resident in the parish, please enter your postcode into <u>www.achurchnearyou.com</u> for confirmation. (You do not have to be resident in the parish to join the electoral roll, you just need to habitually attend worship at either church!)




