Racial Justice Sunday is for all churches to reflect on the importance of racial justice, to give thanks for the gifts and beauty of human diversity, and to commit to end racism and acts of discrimination.

A **Taizé** service is meditative in style and includes sung or chanted prayers, periods of silence and readings from the Bible. It is the repetitive nature of the singing that allows the mind and heart the freedom to go deeper into worship.

Thought for the Day by John Gray

"Don't be afraid; from now on you will fish for people." Luke 5:10

It is unsurprising that fishermen appear multiple times in the gospels when talking of Jesus' ministry in Galilee – the historian Josephus (writing later in the 1st century) talks of there being 230 boats on the Sea of Galilee, so there was clearly a significant fishing fleet. In the story from Luke chapter 5, the overnight fishing has been hard work for little reward. For some people fishing is a relaxing, possibly even meditative hobby, but fishing for a living is hard, dangerous work even to this day. Two of my grandparents came from Scottish fishing communities and one great-grandfather was forbidden to go to sea by his mother as both his father and brother had been lost to fishing accidents. Fishing communities had their own powerful traditions and superstitions, perhaps reflecting the unpredictable and hazardous nature of the occupation.

For Simon Peter and his companions, the size of the catch after a long unsuccessful night demonstrates the power of Jesus, and results in them leaving everything behind for a new mission. The calling of these disciples – "From now on you will fish for people" is trading one kind of hard work for another, seemingly very different, task. What could these fishermen bring to a growing religious movement but their pre-existing skills: the practice of humility, patience and trust, and a willingness to work hard. How might these be reflected in our own discipleship?

There is also the opportunity to be anointed with oil. Both are optional; you are simply invited to come as you are, bringing and sharing your burdens with God who knows us deeply.

Parish Motto for 2025 - Message from Revd Ange

During these winter months, we look for signs of hope. The first sightings of snowdrops cause our hearts to fill with joy at the thought that the days will be soon getting longer, and we shall see growth in nature. As we journey together as a Christian community, we have chosen a piece of scripture to help us see spiritual growth this year. Paul wrote to the church community in Ephesus, "Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love" (chapter 4, verse 2). This verse will be our parish motto in 2025. We've chosen it for several reasons: firstly because it will give some shape to our growth as disciples. Every ministry in our parish will be encouraged to consider and discuss 'what does this mean for me and for the area of church that I'm involved in'? Secondly, because it is a 'being' word and not a 'doing' word. This is not about promoting more activity, but looking inside ourselves to see how God is encouraging us to grow. I'm looking forward to seeing how we grow as a community this year, and for God to guide us as we do so.
