Thought for the Day by Cheryl Hall

The background to this morning's New Testament reading of the Beatitudes is interesting. Jesus shows the scribes and Pharisees that it is better to do good than evil on the sabbath. To act with kindness is better than following the letter of The Law if the result is an omission. They disapprove. He heals the withered hand of a man in the Synagogue knowing that he will be held to account for it, regardless. He then chooses his apostles and their first taste of the life to come happens soon

afterwards when he takes them to a level place and, surrounded by a multitude, proceeds to heal those gathered of their diseases and ailments.

What comes next is significant. He turns, not to the crowd, but to his disciples. He is addressing *them* when he starts. What he issues is both a promise and a warning of things to come. His statements are essentially questions. He is effectively asking them:

Can you stand the heat? Will you take the pressure? Are you able to go without **for** *my* **sake**? Are you prepared to set aside the things of this life for the life to come? Ultimately....Can I *trust* you?

Of course, at least one among them could not answer yes to any of these questions despite being a literal follower of Christ. Judas is present when Jesus makes his powerful speech. How interesting then that what follows in verse 27 is a plea to love our enemies and do good to those that treat us badly. It must have been so hard for Jesus to bear this betrayal, but he did so with equanimity and grace, once more modelling to us how to do the right thing in the face of the unimaginable.

Parish Motto for 2025 - Message from Revd Ange

During these winter months, we look for signs of hope. The first sightings of snowdrops cause our hearts to fill with joy at the thought that the days will be soon getting longer, and we shall see growth in nature. As we journey together as a Christian community, we have chosen a piece of scripture to help us see spiritual growth this year. Paul wrote to the church community in Ephesus, "Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love" (chapter 4, verse 2). This verse will be our parish motto in 2025. We've chosen it for several reasons: firstly because it will give some shape to our growth as disciples. Every ministry in our parish will be encouraged to consider and discuss 'what does this mean for me and for the area of church that I'm involved in'? Secondly, because it is a 'being' word and not a 'doing' word. This is not about promoting more activity, but looking inside ourselves to see how God is encouraging us to grow. And thirdly, because it will make us dependent on God. It's very hard to be even a little bit humble, let alone completely humble! And yet with God's Holy Spirit living in us, we can continue to be changed into a community which draws other in to know God's love. I'm looking forward to seeing how we grow as a community this year, and for God to guide us as we do so.

New Electoral roll

Every six years, a completely new church Electoral Roll must be prepared in each parish. 2025 is the year to prepare the new roll.

Electoral rolls provide a true indication of the real membership and strength of the Church, both locally and nationally. Putting your name on the roll is a way of saying "I belong"; it is an act of commitment to your local church and to the Church as a whole.

Joining the electoral roll opens up the way for greater involvement in the life of the Church, at parish, deanery, diocesan and national levels. You become entitled to vote at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting.

It is an important statement of witness, and step along the path of discipleship. With your name on the electoral roll the strength of the Church can be seen in our area, and across the country.
