# Thought for the Day by Jennifer Holloway

Easter as a major celebration dates back to the 2nd century. It preached the Mystery of Christ, emphasizing the need for adequate preparation, prayer and fasting, according to the ways of Christ, before he entered into resurrected life. By the 4th century this became a liturgical reality known as the 6 weeks' Lenten Season. Today is the first Sunday in the season. In Luke 4 v 1-13, the story of Jesus being tempted in the wilderness is told. Jesus rejects what might be seen as good opportunities or offers and accepts God as being the true source of fulfilment. Jesus rejects the devil and thus malintentions.

In Romans 10 v 8-13, we learn that no matter who we are, everyone who calls upon the Lord will be saved" (v 13). What we say, what we do and what we believe in our hearts really does matter. Some of these words are intentionally in the Choristers Prayer.

Lent gives us the time to mindfully reflect on our Christian beliefs, and the Parish gives us many opportunities to help us do this. May we, in our turn, also enter the joy we will later celebrate on Easter Day, when we know that Christ has indeed been resurrected!

There is also the opportunity to be anointed with oil. Both are optional; you are simply invited to come as you are, bringing and sharing your burdens with God who knows us deeply.

#### **New Electoral roll**

Every six years, a completely new church Electoral Roll must be prepared in each parish. 2025 is the year to prepare the new roll.

Electoral rolls provide a true indication of the real membership and strength of the Church, both locally and nationally. Putting your name on the roll is a way of saying "I belong"; it is an act of commitment to your local church and to the Church as a whole.

Joining the electoral roll opens up the way for greater involvement in the life of the Church, at parish, deanery, diocesan and national levels. You become entitled to vote at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting.

It is an important statement of witness, and step along the path of discipleship. With your name on the electoral roll the strength of the Church can be seen in our area, and across the country.

Please do complete the application form by using <u>this link</u>. The form only takes a minute to complete, and your response will be automatically uploaded into Churchdesk, our secure church management system. Please note that if you complete this electronic form, you **do not** need to complete the paper forms which are in church. **The form is now open and will close on Monday 14**<sup>th</sup> **April**.

If you are unsure whether you are resident in the parish, please enter your postcode into <u>www.achurchnearyou.com</u> for confirmation. (You do not have to be resident in the parish to join the electoral roll, you just need to habitually attend worship at either church!)
